Tree

Chilling Medium to high

Vigour Weak to moderate

Growth habit Spreading

Full bloom End September, early October

Pollinators Golden Delicious, Hillieri, Gala

Bearing habit Spurs and shoots

Production Very good







Fruit

Harvest Late March (dependent on area)

Mass/Fruit size 180g

Shape Globose

Skin colour Heavy red stripe over a cream background,

blushed appearance on some fruit

Lenticels Conspicuous

Flesh colour White

Taste Fragrant, less acid than standard Braeburn

Texture Firm and juicy

Storage ability Good

Thinning recommended otherwise variety might over crop. Definitely better colour than standard Braeburn, with less acid. Tighter harvest window. Bitterpit control essential. Honeycore occurs in ripe fruit.
