


MegaOne (F116)



Blueberry type: Southern Highbush.

Released: 2019 Selection.

Key attributes: MegaOne has been exclusively released to TopFruit as

> a commercial selection in most regions south of the equator. This very low chill variety has very large, firm, flavourful berries with good production potential. This

variety has the potential to bear large-sized primocane fruit very early in the harvest season.

Chilling Required: Low chill (-100h < 7.2C).

Flowering: Flowers in South Africa May-June in cooler climates

> and March-April in Limpopo. Flowers Feb-April in Zimbabwe. PDF = 85 Days. Very big bell-shaped

flowers.

Pollinator: Shows signs of parthenocarpy, but bees are advised.

Harvest: Very early to mid-season: Western Cape: July to October,

Limpopo: May to September and Zimbabwe: April to

September.

Plant Vigour: Upright to spreading with moderate to strong growth.

Yield: Good (18 - 20ton/ha). First-year production:

1.75kg/bush, Second year: 2-3kg/bush and mature plants

4kg+/bush.

Berry size: Very Large size fruit (1.8 – 2.8g/berry), between 16-

26mm. (50% above 18mm).

Fruit shape: Oblate

Colour: Medium blue to light blue.

Bloom: Strong; light blue.

Picking: Easy picking with small dry scar.

Firmness: Very firm with good shelf life. The fruit is crisp with a

pop sensation when eaten.

Flavour: Crisp & sweet with good brix, average acidity, very good

eating. Brix 12.5 - 14 with an average of 13.

Licensed

Countries: South Africa, Zimbabwe, Namibia, Angola, Botswana,

Kenya, Swaziland, Mozambique, Zambia, Tanzania, Uganda, Rwanda, Malawi, Lesotho and Ethiopia.

Disease: Little rust has been observed.

Comments: Very early floricane-type bearer with some primocane

production.
